HOW TO FIND US



Tutzing is located approximately 35 km southwest of Munich on Lake Starnberg (Starnberger See).

From Munich Central Station (Hauptbahnhof): Take the urban railway S-6 (S-Bahn) or the regional train (RB) to Tutzing. At the train station in Tutzing, take the Bus 958/978 to "Klenzestraße". You will also find cabs at the front entrance of Tutzing train station. Please note our special offers for conference tickets through the Deutsche Bahn (DB) found on our Website, see contact "how to find us".



From the airport take the urban railway S-1 or S-8 to Munich Central Station and follow the instructions above.



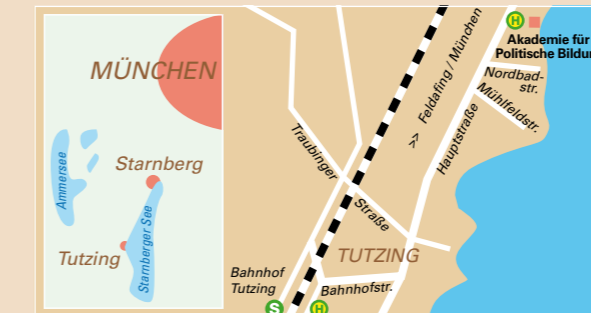
You can also reach the Academy by foot from Tutzing train station. It takes you 20 to 30 minutes.



To reach the Academy by car, take freeway A95 from Munich via A952 to Starnberg and continue on the federal highway until you pass the town of Traubing, then take a left. At the end of the road turn right to Tutzing. The Academy is on your left shortly after passing the town sign Tutzing.

Research on the Holocaust in Israel and Germany

New Findings Presented for School Teachers



October 15 – 20, 2023

INVITATION

Holocaust Education represents an integral part of teaching both in Israel and Germany. Yet, research on Holocaust has fundamentally changed in the past two decades. Especially from the 1990s on the main interest of research has shifted from an earlier focus on extermination camps like Auschwitz-Birkenau to mass shootings in Eastern Europe which had long been neglected by researchers. A very recent effect of this general shift of Holocaust research was that more attention was given to the microhistory of the Holocaust on an individual or local level. Furthermore, the complex interaction between the German perpetrators, their non-German accomplices but also local administrations, churches or the general population has become a focal point of research on Holocaust.

Our teacher's seminar aims at connecting these recent academic developments with a debate on how to translate these new findings to be used in schools. To this end, teachers and trainee teachers from Israel and Germany will meet at lake Starnberg to allow such a debate in a transnational context. The idea is to learn from each other and mutually develop (digital and non-digital) teaching units to be used in both countries.
